Thank you for your inquiry about Immanuel preschool! Our program centers around the belief that children learn best in a rich environment that gives them opportunities to explore, manipulate, predict, observe, and develop pre-academics, creativity, and individual abilities in a developmentally appropriate way. The children's social interactions are important components of their development, also, so we provide many ways for the children to interact in small and large groups, encouraging caring and constructive ways of relating. The environment in which the learning takes place mirrors the loving, forgiving, encouraging activity of our Lord Jesus towards all of us. The teachers at Immanuel Preschool all have experience in early childhood settings, and one has a master's degree in the field. My bachelor's degree is in early childhood education. I oversee curriculum development. The aides also have degrees and/or extensive experience with children. All work as a team to share ideas and practices considered by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) to be developmentally appropriate and marks of excellence. The program is also accredited by the National Lutheran School Association. We are a Level 3 Paths to Quality program and offer On My Way PreK scholarships.

Preschool Curriculum

Our commitment is to nurture children's spiritual growth and their love of learning. We believe that young children learn best in an enriched play setting. We provide many opportunities for children to grow intellectually, emotionally, socially, physically, and spiritually through our Christian environment and play based learning. Dedicated staff and educated teachers provide a warm, Christian environment, while our developmentally appropriate curriculum help prepare children for the next steps in their education.

Faith development is at the core of our curriculum and is integrated into every aspect of teaching.

Presented below are curriculum goals that, by the end of their prekindergarten year, students will achieve. The goals are all encompassing, and are taught throughout the day, across the whole curriculum. These standards are compiled from the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), the Indiana Foundations for Early Childhood, and the Indiana District of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

As a result of their schooling, students will...

Spiritual Development

- Believe in the Triune God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit
- Believe that God created them, knows and loves them
- Believe that God sent Jesus to be their Savior and that He died and rose again
- Pray with their class and on their own
- Trust that God keeps His promises and has a plan for our lives
- Participate in Jesus times and chapel worship
- Share the Good News with believers and non-believers

Language Arts

- Recognize the letters in the alphabet
- Recognize their name in print
- Understand basic book conventions
- Tell and retell stories
- Ask and answer questions
- Recognize writing is a way of communication
- Recognize that each letter in the alphabet has a sound
- Listens to others and takes turns when speaking

Mathematics

- Recognize numerals 0-10 and rote counts to 30
- Count with one to one correspondence
- Recognize, and extend patterns
- Recognize shapes (2D and 3D)
- Sort objects
- Recognize days of the week, dates, and months of the year

Science

- Interact with, manipulate, explore and describe a variety of materials
- Observe the world around them (water, air, rocks, shells, etc.)
- Use scientific tools (scales, magnifying glasses, magnets, etc.)
- Experience God's nature
- Learning about recycling as a means for caring about God's earth

Social Studies

- Begin to follow simple directions and rules
- Take part in classroom discussions and respectfully listen to others
- Exhibit honesty, cooperation, responsibility in classroom relationships and in problem solving situations with peers and adults
- Understand that God has created people to have different characteristics, interests, and abilities
- Begin to distinguish between past, present, and future
- Begin to give information about where he/she lives

Creative Arts

- Sing along to familiar songs
- Listen to a variety of musical styles
- Participates in music activities
- Name and identify colors
- Mix new colors
- Use different tools to make art creations
- Express what they observe, think, imagine, and feel in dramatic play through storytelling, puppetry, and other language development activities

Physical Health

- Understand and engage in independent practices of self care, dietary, and hygiene habits
- Follows basic safety rules to keep self and other safe
- Perform large motor skills (running, marching, twisting, etc.)

Social/Emotional

- Describe self by using several basic characteristics, and draw oneself
- Express and regulate a range of emotions appropriately
- Identify personal preferences, thoughts and feelings
- Accept responsibility for and consequences of one's own actions
- Develop relationships with peers and adults
- Use appropriate communication skills when expressing needs, wants, and feelings
- Resolve conflicts with peers alone or with adult intervention when appropriate

More About Thematic Units

A thematic, play-based approach is used to develop the curriculum in the Immanuel preschool program. Subject areas and skills are integrated into the themes, which are incorporated throughout the classroom.

For example, in the dramatic play area there may be a pumpkin patch and a farmer's market stand. In the science center, students can weigh pumpkins and gourds, and sort by size. In the blocks, students can use orange balls that look like pumpkins, and blocks to create ramps which they create to roll the balls down. In the sensory table, there would be pumpkin sorting. At our learning centers, there would be making emotions on pumpkin faces, playing a matching pumpkin game with a friend, and a pumpkin puzzle. The teacher will read a pumpkin themed book and have a variety of songs and fingerplays to work on rhyming and singing to sing with the children. The art project for the day might be exploring the inside of a pumpkin, and then painting what they see.

Parent Teacher Communication

Parent-teacher conferences are held twice a year to evaluate and discuss your child's development. Our teachers are also available to meet with you whenever you have concerns. Monthly newsletters from your child's teacher will also keep you informed of upcoming activities and events.

Additionally, we offer an open door policy that allows you to schedule a visit, or drop in, on your child's class to see how they are doing.

Field Trips

In addition to the hands on learning in the classroom, preschoolers enjoy field trips to surrounding locations around Valparaiso. These trips are based on what they students are learning in the classroom during that month. Parents are encouraged to chaperone and share the field experiences with their child.
